



## Covid 19 Policy

The Fusion 2.0 team is excited and optimistic about gathering together in person this fall! Our utmost priority is to create an experience that is as rewarding as it is safe.

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues, so does our learning of what the best practices and most current safety strategies to implement intentionally.

All participants, including, but not limited to, attendees, speakers, sponsors, exhibitors, volunteers, vendors & service providers, and others are expected to abide by our code of conduct and all policies in effect for the event.

We will continue to monitor and update safety precautions regularly and coordinate with trusted national resources, state and local public health agencies, and the hotel/venue.

We reserve the right to modify these policies and procedures at any time given the rapidly changing nature of the current global pandemic.

Our current policy is that any participant in the event (attendee, speaker, sponsor, exhibitor, volunteer vendor) must [be fully vaccinated](#), or test negative on a PCR test within 72 hours prior to your arrival at the event.

***Updated on January 16, 2022, the CDC indicates "Fully Vaccinated" and "Up to date" as such:***

- "Full vaccination" means that either 14 days have passed since receiving the second dose of FDA or WHO authorized (or emergency use authorized) double-dosed vaccines or single-dose vaccine. Proof of vaccination will be required to attend.
- "Up to Date" means a person has received all recommended COVID-19 vaccines, including any booster dose(s) when eligible. By Sept 2022, we expect that all eligible people will have received (at least) one booster dose.

***On-site safety plans will include (but not limited to):***

- 1) Verification of vaccination record (and/or negative PCR test results)
- 2) Face masks will be required when not eating or drinking
- 3) Coordination with hotel staff for regular and thorough cleaning
- 4) Signage will be present throughout the conference to remind you to wear your face mask, and to wash your hands/ use hand sanitizer frequently.
